



TEIMUN Conference 2026 Financial Aid Policy

Valid: 01/01/2026 – 31/12/2026

Under certain conditions, the Board of TEIMUN may choose to financially aid participants in their participation in TEIMUN. In this way, the conference is made more accessible to those ambitious students who may not have the means to participate themselves. Please note that 75% reduction fee is the maximum a participant can obtain, however the Board of Directors reserves the discretion to decide a lower reduction fee on the basis of the application's standard.

1. Who Can Apply for Financial Aid?

All TEIMUN participants may apply for financial aid. If you wish to receive financial aid, you have to first apply for it before signing up for the conference and getting accepted. Hence, you should **not** register through mymun yet before completing the application process for the financial aid.

To apply, you must first submit the required documents outlined in below directly to our Participants Coordinator for an individual assessment. The Participants Coordinator and the Treasurer will evaluate your eligibility and determine the amount of financial aid you may receive. Following this assessment, you will receive an email with the decision. If your application is approved, the email will include a discount code.

When registering on the mymun platform, you will need to submit some of your documents again. At the payment stage, where the standard fee is **€140** for early birds and **€160** for general, you may enter the discount code provided to pay the reduced amount determined by the Participants Coordinator and the Treasurer.

Please note that **both visa and non-visa delegations of above 12 participants are not eligible for financial aid**, as they already benefit from a **10% discount**.

2. How Do I Apply?

In order to receive financial aid, you should send an application to the Participants Coordinator (participants@teimun.org). The deadline for applying for Financial Aid is 2 weeks before the application deadline for the TEIMUN Conference (16th of April 2026 for visa delegates and 5th of June 2026 for non-visa delegates). The application should include:

1. Your resumé (CV);
2. A one-page motivation letter stating why you need financial aid, including a clear indication of how much aid you are requesting with a maximum of 120€ (75% of general fee);
3. An essay on the conference theme (500-750 words)

Once the Board has received your application, they will carefully consider it and decide if you will be eligible for financial aid, and the amount you will be granted. This decision is based on the reasons you provide as to why you should receive the aid, as well as the quality of your essay. The Board will inform you about their decision as soon as possible. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered.

3. Other Terms & Conditions for Financial Aid

1. The Board takes plagiarism very seriously. If it is discovered that one has copied parts of the texts of others into their application documents, the participant runs the risk of having their financial aid application, as well as their entire participation, cancelled.
2. The applicant has to meet the criteria for TEIMUN participation. These include being between 18 and 30 years of age, being enrolled as a university student, and having good command of spoken and written English (subject to potential assessment through video call).
3. The applicant for financial aid might be interviewed by the Participants Coordinator or the Treasurer to verify the truthfulness of the reasons for the request of financial aid.
4. The applicant must send all the requisite documents to the Participants Coordinator. Failure to do so will lead to a disregard of the application for financial aid.
5. Financial aid applications can only be done, and will be assessed, on an individual basis. The decision will be made in a timely manner no longer than 10 working days.
6. At no time will financial aid be given out in cash.
7. The Board will only consider the forms of financial aid mentioned above; all other requests will not be honoured.
8. The Board of Directors reserves the right to make any changes to the above terms as it sees fit without prior notification. Furthermore, the Board reserves the right to grant or deny financial aid. This decision will always be based on a thorough examination of the individual application. It is therefore very important that the applicant provides the Board with the right documents when asked to do so, in a timely manner.
